At the Time of Criticism

We emphasize the need for moderation and balance when faced with the unhappy situations of others; however, there are moments when the batteries of criticism target us.

With friends and opponents, we hear objections and reprimands, and frequently fall mentally into rebelliousness or depression.

Yet, bitterness and sadness do nothing constructive.

In any difficulty, irritation, or discouragement only obscure situations or complicate problems.

Hit by accusations and reproaches, we need to carry out a thorough self-examination.

Let's take time out from our activities to pray and reflect, searching for the depths of our souls.

Let's analyze, without the slightest self-pity, all the events that dictate our orientation and conduct, weighing up the facts and designs that motivated the warnings in question, with rigorous sincerity.

If our inner self points out faults on our side, let's have enough courage to make up for them, either by apologizing to those we have offended or taking steps to remedy the damage we have caused.

Yet, if we are attentive to the duty that life assigns us, if our intentions and behavior make us sure that we are following the right path for the benefit of all and not ours, let's settle into peace and conformity.

And even though we are surrounded by complaints and turmoil, let's carry on with the work we must do without despair and sorrow, aware that above the comfort of being immediately understood, there is the tranquility of conscience in our obligation's fulfillment.

Three Conclusions

No matter how long the time bestowed to a Spirit for a reincarnation, it is always short compared to the service we are entrusted with.

Important, therefore, is the use of hours.

Let's reflect on the excessive time we lightly dedicate to other people's business.

How many thousands of minutes and sentences do we waste every decade, without the slightest helpfulness, approaching themes and issues that don't concern us?

To counteract this useless waste, let's reflect on three conclusions of fundamental interest.

What others think ~ What others think is their idea.

We can't use their heads to give them the interpretations they are capable of before life.

An Indian man and a physicist contemplate light, maintaining antagonistic concepts.

The same thing happens in moral life. We need to nourish our brains with clean thoughts, but it is not in our power to demand that our neighbor thinks like us.

What others say ~ The words of friends and adversaries, acquaintances and strangers, are a verbal creation that

belongs to them. They express themselves as they can and commit to everyday occurrences with worthy or less worthy feelings.

We indeed must cultivate judicious conversation; however, we do not have the means to interfere in the personal manifestations of those around us, no matter how dear they may be to us.

What others do - Our brothers and sisters' activities result from their choices and resolutions.

We know that Divine Wisdom did not create us to be copies of each other. Each consciousness is a separate domain.

The creatures around us certainly act with excellent intentions in this or that sphere of work, and if they can't yet understand the merit of sincerity and beneficence, it is their problem, not ours.

It's easy to deduce that we can't shy away from the noble action in our own favor, but it's not up to us to impose on other people's decisions, which the Creator Himself leaves free.

Given this, let's cooperate with others and receive the help we need from them, respecting everyone, but without wasting time on what they might think, say or do. In short, respect for others is an obligation that falls to us.

Around Obsession

The success of positive thinking depends on positive work.

An outstanding construction project will combine magnificent plans based on the most advanced civilization practices. However, to succeed, it needs proper materials to withstand destructive forces.

In a reinforced concrete building, no one will think of using wooden poles instead of iron structures or replacing crushed stone with rammed earth. To perform the task well, the substances must be in the correct conditions and

positions. The same principles govern the plane of the soul.

If we aspire to build achievements that meet the high standards of our ideals, we must select the ingredients that constitute our inner life, cultivating goodness in the minimal manifestations. Any contrary action will compromise the stability of the organization we intend to make.

Thus, let's consider sanitizing our emotions, ideas, words, attitudes, and actions, no matter how small they may be.

We all talk about the danger of evil agents that threaten us; nevertheless, they only dominate where we favor their intrusion.

As a rule, it begins with the imprudence of the breach...

Today, a complaint; tomorrow, a moment of bitterness; soon, a reckless argument; later, a crisis of anguish perfectly removable through service; now, a depressing comment; then, a minute of irritation; and, finally, illness, delinquency, disturbance, and sometimes premature death.

A big disaster is often the sum of small mistakes. Let's be sure that so it is also in obsession cases.

Healing Obsession

Recognizing in the obsessed person, whoever they may be, a sick relative to whom we owe the utmost consideration and assistance.

Balancing our words of help with consolation and enlightenment, gentleness and energy.

In obsession cases, we should:

- Include the body's needs when dealing with the soul's needs.

- Combining medication, personal hygiene, and prayer.

- Also, consider work a healing method based on the patient's abilities and strengths.

- When dealing with obsessed ones, avoid promoting or reinforcing the influence of negative entities, and eliminate suggestions of fear.

- Treat the disturbed spirits who may communicate in the sick environment not as executioners but as brothers and sisters needy of assistance and pity.

- Prevent comments about the unbalanced or depressing conversations of unfortunate disincarnated spirits.

- Police our manners and phrases, convincing ourselves that the obsessed person often represents a whole phalanx

of intelligence needed for comfort and direction, even though invisible to the eye.

-Avoid susceptibility to supposed offenses in the obsessed person's family environment, understanding that the obsession installed in a determinate place sometimes resembles a cyst in the body, extending its roots everywhere.

-Understand rather than get emotional.

-Refrain from taboos and rituals, whose harmful effects will remain in the mind of the obsessed after the very cure.

-Ask for the cooperation of enlightened friends who can help the patient.

Control ourselves. Don't be curious about the events of the cure, bearing in mind that it falls to us do good with discretion and humility.

Teach, but also practice charity, noting that in many cases, the obsessed person and those who make up their domestic team lack even sustenance.

Suppress, as much as possible, the elements that refer to sadness and discouragement, distress or tension in the work you carry out.

Do not attribute the encouraging results of the treatment

to yourself, disregarding the hidden and providential action of the Good Spirits.

Educate the obsessed person in Spiritist principles by taking them to a doctrinal temple, where they can assimilate Spiritism's logical and fundamental lessons.

Help without demanding.

Support the companion in need without censorship, even if apparent reasons induce you to do so while remembering that Jesus Christ, the initiator of Disobsession on Earth, healed the sick without hurting or condemning anyone.

Crises Without Pain

It's easy to recognize open crises.

An externalized ordeal means difficulty ahead.

They usually come as illnesses, disenchantments, accidents, or heart trials.

They attract the spontaneous support of those around them, to whom the victims lean, overcoming days of anguish with serenity and courage, like someone who crosses long tunnels of affliction without higher risk.

We do, however, have disastrous crises without pain, those that hide under the safety of the surface:

- When we settle for inertia on the pretext of having worked too hard...
- On occasions we demand that our neighbor become undue support in the game of usury or in the attack of ambition...
- For as long as we admit our supposed superiority over others.
- Whenever we think we're infallible, even when we're enjoying the highest positions on the paths of humanity.
- When we believe ourselves to be so supposedly wise and virtuous that we no longer need warnings and corrections in our tasks.

Whatever the circumstances in which we deliberately avoid the imperatives of self-education or helping others, we are in a dangerous situation in our spiritual life, with the obligation to make an intense effort not to fall to a lower level of feeling and conduct.

Let us free ourselves from the complexes of greed and vanity, stubbornness and laziness that lull us into insensitivity to the point that we do not register the slightest manifestation of suffering.

It is often through these elements that the most significant spiritual disasters occur within and around us, whether due to neglecting duty or succumbing to obsession.

Voluntary Dead

Generally, the human mind is conditioned to believe that organic maturity is the antechamber of helplessness, and many people undeservedly resign from the duty that life has delegated to them.

Countless companions, because they have reached professional retirement or for having embraced children, say they are at the end of their physical careers.

They forget that the ripened fruit guarantees the entire renewal of the species, and they lie prostrate on the threshold of inertia, proclaiming discouragement.

They talk about dusk as if they did not count on the tomorrow morning.

They begin any comment on the burning issues of the present with the classic phrase: "It was not like that in my day."

Meanwhile, life around them is a permanent challenge to progress and transformation, calling them to rejuvenation.

Their children ask them for healthy guidance, their grandchildren ask them for soul warmth, their friends ask

them for the help of experience, and the brothers and sisters of Humanity count on them for new evolutionary journeys.

Yet, it's enough to think that children and young people can't hit their stride without mentors trained in experience and experts in discernment and work, so they don't underestimate their role.

Let's not forget that the Spirit reincarnates, going through the difficult stages of childhood and youth to reach physiological adulthood and begin to live from the point of view of individual responsibility.

How many obstacles were overcome and how many illusions crossed to consolidate a reincarnation, far from the narrow beaches of the cradle and childhood, so that the Spirit, a voyager of eternity, reaches the high seas of earthly experience!

However, many fortunate people who enter the golden age of reflection with all the possibilities of creative service stagnate in their supposed incapacity, knocking on the door of disenchantment like those who indulge in the voluptuousness of self-pity.

Let us work to exterminate the plague of discouragement in hearts that have reached the precious stage of prudence and understanding.

Life is an eternal flame. Every day is a time to invent, clarify, and move forward.

Experienced companions in earthly endeavors are the vanguard of those reborn on the planet and not the so-called “rear” that the grumbling of many has imagined to depress the best time of the creature reincarnated on Earth.

Disincarnation is the liberation of the soul; death is something else. Death is the cessation of life, rot, and mold.

Those discouraged from fighting, working, renewing, and evolving are the ones who die, even though they are alive, becoming mummies of denial and laziness.

When disincarnation passes through them, transfiguring them, they continue to be in the condition of voluntary dead who refuse to live.

Let's follow the march of the Sun, which every day creates, transforms, experiments, and beautifies.

Let us renew ourselves.

In Examining Forgiveness

When Tired

When fatigue seeks you out in the service of good, reflect on the brothers and sisters who sigh for the minimum of facilities that enrich your hands.

Consider not only the difficulties of those who, at the height of their physical strength, are affected by brain injuries but also the misfortune of those who fight obsessive processes linked to the darkness of delinquency. Observe not only the torture of the paralyzed, confined to beds of trial but also the pain of those who have not

understood the educational function of earthly straining and live with their hearts hardened in indifference.

Consider not only the torture of those born in a painful condition of idiocy, needing other's resources in the minimal operations of organic life but also the dangerous imbalance of those who, in the fastness of material comfort, slip into atheism and vanity, deliberately avoiding the spiritual realities.

Meditate not only on the affliction of those injured in terrible disasters but also on the anguish of those run over by slander, collapsing morally in rebelliousness and criminality, for being unable to assimilate the benefit of pain.

When fatigue lurks in your action sphere, think of the companions trapped in the hardship of body and soul, waiting for the help, however small, of your thought, word, providence, and hands..

If discouragement threatens you, examine whether it is not just a desire to rest before your time, and if you recognize that you have the energy to be helpful, do not trust yourself to inertia or lamentation. When fatigue strikes, remember that someone guides and strengthens you in carrying out your tasks from on High. Someone with enough love and power to wait for your

resources and gifts in the construction of a Better Life..

That someone is Jesus, whom we accept as our Master and once said, positively, in front of followers amazed to see Him serving on a day of rest: **“My Father works until today, and I work too.”**

Imaginary Diseases

We are often faced with a distressing problem whose solution lies within us.

We blame it on long ranks of our brothers and sisters who not only make the home unhappy, where they should sustain equilibrium, but also swarm into doctors' offices and nursing homes, taking the place of those who are genuinely in need.

We refer to less vigilant people, always inclined to exaggerate any symptoms or impressions and become false patients, making themselves victims in the realms of imaginary illnesses.

They sometimes experience mild intoxication, which can be overcome without much effort, and, overdramatizing small organic maladjustments, they drench themselves in drugs, respectable, when necessary, though working like inopportune electric charges whenever improperly applied.

As they reach this point, such devotees of fantasy and destructive fear fall physically into wear and tear processes whose consequences no one can predict. They might also enter, without noticing, the subtle calamities of hidden obsession, where unfortunate spirits dilapidate their strength.

After that, as body or mind alteration occurs, naturally, real imbalance appears and consolidates, even bringing about premature disembodiment. It only aggravates the responsibility of the numb ones towards life, who have no courage to work, suffer, and fight.

Let us guard against this unnecessary danger.

If pain appears, let us examine our behavior, checking whether we have not given rise to Nature's beneficial warning.

If nervous depression arises, let's examine the content of the emotions we are giving our thoughts' energies, to know if tiredness isn't just a healthy warning from our soul so we can clarify our existence and course.

Before launching any anguished cry for help, let's learn to help ourselves through careful and conscious self-analysis.

Even if it's not for us, let's do it for others, those who love us and inconsequentially waste valuable resources and time suffering in vain with the frivolity and weakness we surrender to.

Those of us working diligently in the Spiritist Doctrine should focus devotedly on fighting the imaginary illnesses that can make us endure unnecessary suffering caused by self-obsession.

In work's environment, no matter how important it may seem, production only appears in its precise output if it is kept in orchestral music form, assigning each instrument its responsibility.

Civilization and culture are based on team spirit, with interdependence in between.

Identical principles prevail in the realm of the soul, calling on our free will to the safety and happiness of all those who share our experience.

Without any pretensions of a political nature, the Spiritist Doctrine currently operates in the religious field of humanity, as a providential mechanism of alert, inducing us to the natural and spontaneous participation in the construction of the common welfare.

For centuries and centuries, we have preserved ignorance and deprivation, war and crime, in the name of God's Will.

Yet, Spiritism, by restoring the message of Christianity, which came to establish fraternity among men, asks each of us whether we would be really determined to live under the Will of God if we were among the victims of poverty and darkness of spirit.

Let us use all our possibilities, resources, or skills to build new times.

Solidarity and cooperation, understanding and concord, and love moving from theory to practical life.

The golden rule, to be duly complemented, is not restricted to the negative structure: **“Do not do to others what you do not wish them to do”**. It requires full observance of the positive form in which it is expressed: **“We must do to others everything we want them to do to us.”**

And, unawares, without paying more attention to the teachings of the Doctrine they embrace, they crystallize nonsense in their way of being.

They usually fall in love with social exteriorities and choose a determinate class to attend.

They isolate themselves in a segregationist group, although they consider themselves to be representatives

of the highest orthodoxy in terms of opinion.

They believe much more in the transient titles of academicism and economic facilities than in the substantial value of people.

They esteem spectacle above service, and show a beyond than the fair appreciation to the world's medallions, as they become more distant and ashamed of relations with the humble.

They are always willing to give orders at work about organization, time, place, and conditions without allowing the work to command them in the established arrangements and disciplines.

In works of charity, they treat brothers and sisters in need as if they were social outcasts while they bow reverently before any figure of worldly prominence of dubious merit.

We, disincarnate and incarnate Spiritists, must stand sentry against such absurdity.

Snobbery ~ let us repeat ~ is a parasite that destroys the tree of our principles and achievements.

Let's be vigilant.

Let's imitate the correct farmer who looks after his own crops, and if snobbery sneaks into our activities, let's immediately try to get rid of it.

Forgiveness and Us

comments, all the little injustices of everyday life:

- The pejorative reference;
- An unanswered appeal;
- The kindness refused;
- The forgotten benefit;
- The harsh gesture
- An aggressive voice;
- The thoughtless word;
- A scornful smile;
- The ironic remark;
- The compromising indiscretion;
- A depressing concept;
- An unjust accusation;
- An unjustifiable omission;
- The malicious comment;
- The unexpected snub;
- The contempt in the family;
- Being overlooked in any way;
- The impious message...

Let's not delude ourselves when it comes to indulgence.

Forgiveness is not a resource to be applied only to great moral pain, like formal attire, solely worn at ceremonial times.

We are all susceptible to error, and for this very reason, forgiveness is necessary all the time.

Though, just as a composer cannot obtain a symphony without going through solfeggio, forgiveness does not exist on our part before great offenses if we do not learn to overlook small indelicacies.

Resignation and Resistance

We need to study resignation so that patience doesn't bring counterproductive results.

A farmer will bravely endure a downpour and hailstorms in his fields but will not tolerate grasshoppers and weeds.

We usually talk about tolerance as if we were looking for a place to hide our idleness.

If we bask in comfort and immediate advantages in the empire of passing materiality, why would we care about the others' discomfort and disadvantages?

We forget that a neighbor's fire is a fire threat in our house and that unexpectedly unforeseen flames might erupt next to us, compromising our safety and illusory tranquility.

We all need to adjust resignation in the right place.

If the Law presents us with an inevitable disaster, it's not just to break down in shouting and nonconformity. We need to decide to take the remnants and reweave them for good in the loom of life.

If circumstances reveal the incursion of typhus, it's not understandable to fold our arms and let the bacilli spread.

It is always advisable to review our attitudes in the field of conformity.

How do we react to suffering and evil?

If we accept penury for hating work, our poverty results from compulsory merit.

Civilization means continuous work against barbarism.

Hygiene expresses infinitely repeated activity against filth.

In the domains of the soul, all the conquests of the individual on the course of sublimation require harmony with persistent action to preserve them.

Peace ready for alarm. Practice of good works with a safety device.

Serenity is operative constancy; hope is an ideal with work.

No one should cultivate resignation before declared and removable evil, under penalty of aggravating it and suffering its deadly blow.

Let's study resignation in Jesus Christ.

The Master's cross is not a symbol of passivity in the face of cunning and cruelty, but rather a message of resistance against lies and criminality disguised as religion, in a firm protest that continues until today.

Spiritual Support

In every situation, use words and attitudes effectively helpful.

When faced with other people's faults, do not act thoughtlessly, censuring or approving this or that without fair analysis, under the pretext of ensuring harmony, but act with kindness, providing advisable corrections, without fuss and harshness.

If a need for a warning or reprimand arises, since every respectable school demand discipline, offer your example of the duty correctly performed before speaking.

When talking, choose, as far as possible, the place, time, and manner by the commitments you have made to the common good cause.

When reading calamitous news reports or undesirable books, highlight the subjects you feel worthy of appreciation and examine them with the companions of your level of experience. Avoid inconvenient comments with friends of immature understanding.

When spreading or disseminating publications, only pay attention to those likely to benefit readers.

Faced with all the disagreements, conflicts, despairs, and worries, articulate ideas of peace and utter phrases of peace without ignoring that we are all in a permanent struggle against evil and that no enlightened person can believe themselves to be in illusory neutrality.

Pacify others through your unpretentious and spontaneous cooperation in bringing tranquility to them.

Nevertheless, don't deceive anyone with the expectation of a tranquility that only exists in those who run away from their obligations and never prevent disorder.

Wherever you are, administer spiritual help with the lever of your balance.

Vigilance without violence.

Calmness without laziness.

Comfort without lies.

Truth without drama.

If you already know what you must do in the soul sphere, you own a heart called to instruct, which is a legitimate teacher that sees further. Thus, you should not only inform and teach but also support and watch over your neighbor.

Spiritual Environment

In fact, it is necessary to consider that mediumship must be carefully refined to reflect them, and phenomena are

frequently lost in the ashes of doubt or the tumultuous current of discussion.

We are all called to collaborate with the Lord's workers, especially in a favorable environment for their manifestation.

To do this, let's start by banishing all ideas of cruelty, violence, pessimism, and bitterness....

Before interacting with anyone, let's treat them as a sibling who expects from us the love we have been blessed with by Divine Providence.

Whether on the street, at work, or home, let us strive for harmonization and serenity.

In conversation, let's avoid images of irritation or malice.

Let's refrain from repeating comments about scandals and crimes, dwelling on scurrilous cases only for as long as necessary to clarify the truth without turning sincerity into a can of gall.

Let's communicate joy and confidence to those who live with us.

Let us be always ready to do the good we preach, diligently seeking the opportunity to serve.

If we have to correct something in our circle of work, let's put ourselves in the place of the person rectified so that

we can be gentle and, when we give something away, let's imagine ourselves in the position of the recipient so that vanity doesn't creep into our planting of solidarity.

Above all, we must remember that the foundations of any spiritual environment begin in the forces of thought.

We all, discarnate and incarnate spirits linked to the Spiritist-Christian field, count on the support of the Greater Life Instructors.

It is only natural, given the needs that mark our path, but we mustn't forget that they also await our help so they can assist us more widely.

Subtle Spiritual Influences

Whenever you experience a state of mind that tends towards defeatism and has lasted for several hours without a prominent organic or moral cause, consider the case of a subtle spiritual influence.

Be clear with yourself to help the Spiritual Mentors to assist you.

It is the appropriate occasion for humility, prayer, and the magnetic pass.

Among the factors that most reveal this condition of the soul are:

- Difficulty concentrating ideas on optimistic motives;
- Absence of an intimate atmosphere to raise feelings in prayer or concentrate on edifying reading;
- Unexplained indisposition, sadness for no apparent reason and forebodings of immediate disasters;
- Unmanifested annoyances at not finding people or matters on whom or what to unload them;
- Surreptitious pessimism, deaf irritation, complaints, exaggerated sensitivity, and an aptitude for condemning those who are not blameful;
- Forced interpretation of facts and attitudes of yourself or

others, which you know do not correspond to reality;

-Hyperemotionality or depression bordering on the verge of tears;

-Eagerness to play the victim or take an absurd position of self-martyrdom;

-Stubbornness in not accepting, for oneself, the spiritual influence, but after the event, a change in impulses, the repentance, the recompositing of mental tone, and often, the realization that it is too late to undo the mistake made.

These are always discreet and occasional accompaniments on the part of the disincarnate Spirits, invisible to the incarnate one due to the fineness of the process.

The Spirit can be unaware of their actions, causing the individual to think that the adverse effects come from themselves.

When the influencer is conscious, he prepares the event in advance and meticulously, sometimes days and weeks before the sneaky assault, scheduled for the opportunity of a prospective meeting, conversation, receipt of a climactic letter, or unforeseen service crisis.

We don't know what has caused the worst damage to humanity: the spectacular individual and collective

obsessions that everyone notices and helps to undo or isolate, or the half-obsessions of near-obsessives, unnoticed, though much more frequent, which undermine the energy of a single unwary individual, but influence the itinerary of legions of others.

How many disagreements, separations, and failures do not arise this way?

Study whether you haven't been in some circumstance characterized by the subtle spiritual influence in the last fortnight.

Study and help yourself.

The Spiritist in the Group

Novice Mediums

Let's encourage them to recognize that we are all before

generous and wise Spirits, as cooperators before service authorities, who expect us to aid efficiently and spontaneously.

It does not fall to us to move forward without the proper preparation, even supervised by respectable and efficient mentors.

Just as it happens to us, every medium must study to discern and work to deserve it.

Just because mediums can transmit observations and messages, it does not exempt them from the responsibility of presenting, conducting, and applying the subjects they bring.

They must realize that death does not fundamentally alter the human personality.

The access to the discarnate beings' sphere, still attached to the physical plane, is similar to entering a public square on Earth, where Intelligences of all kinds swarm.

Once admitted to constructions of a higher order, the medium is invited to discernment and discipline so that his faculties can be clarified and improved, being a duty to distance himself from the "all-wanting" and "all-doing" to which we are all driven when immature in life, by those inclined to rebellion and disturbance.

Let us help beginner mediums to realize that in mediumship, as in any other earthly activity, there is no truthful knowledge where time has not consecrated learning and that all tasks are noble where the light of charity presides over the accomplishments.

To this end, let's lead them to enlighten themselves in the healthy and liberating principles of the Spiritist Doctrine.

Mediums for phenomena come from everywhere and all positions. Mediums for the edification of improvement and happiness among creatures are only the authentic servants of Humanity.

Some Attitudes that Spiritist Speakers Should Avoid

As a Spiritist speaker places himself before an audience, he must refrain from:

-Speaking without first seeking inspiration from the Good Spirits through prayer.

-Disregarding the needs of those around them, using pejorative concepts, and expressing bitterness and personal complaints in doctrinal presentations.

-Criticizing others' beliefs, even though they must cultivate rational faith without endorsing rites and prejudices.

-Forgetting the necessities and problems of the audience they are addressing.

-Lightly criticizing people's faults and ignoring the need to refer to them, when necessary, to correct them with kindness and understanding,

-Placing themselves on a higher plane as if addressing people from above.

-Using theatrics or sensationalism.

-Divulging consolation based on lies or insults in the name of the truth.

-Disregarding that the unbelievers or outsiders in the audience are brothers and sisters as much in need of understanding as ourselves.

-Running away from simplicity.

-Employing brilliant and useless phrases above sincerity and logic.

-Neglecting to study to renew themselves for better helping those who listen.

-Teaching by wanting applause and advantages for themselves, forgetting the enlightenment and charity they owe to their companions.

"Go and preach the Kingdom of God," Christ told us.

Spiritism, which revives the Gospel of the Lord, teaches us how to preach so that the word does not become empty and faith is not in vain.

Spiritist in a Non-Spiritist Family

Among the issues related to close-knit families, we must consider one of the most important for us: the situation of Spiritist individuals connected to relatives unable to accept Spiritism.

Often, friends who have been through this struggle seek guidance from the Spirit World. They long for an environment that aligns with their beliefs and search for affection to support their efforts.

As the Spirit World respects their free will and helps

solve problems without interfering with their initiative, many become doubtful, with hearts torn between the desire to escape and the fulfillment of their duty.

Spiritists, however, committed to non-Spiritist relatives, remain awake to the realities of reincarnation.

They know that no one assumes obligations outside their heart and no one is reborn for no reason in this or that family group.

Whether in response to affinity demands, choice, atonement, or a specific task, the Spirit reincarnates or works with those it has the task of evolving, improving, paying itself off, discharging certain burdens, or attending to programs of a higher order.

For this reason, they don't have the right to leave the home workshop simply because they don't find people capable of sharing their dreams of elevation.

It is precisely at home, in the forge of disturbing sentimental conflicts that they will build themselves up for the ascent to which they aspire.

Difficult spouses, incomprehensible parents, problem siblings or children make up the teaching staff we need at family schools.

With them and through them, we evaluate our shortcomings to correct them.

Of course, by explaining things in this way, we do not induce any companion to share criminality in the name of obligation. We only wish to point out that there is no sense in abandoning or interrupting edifying adjustments without our conscience being at peace with the duty done.

Whenever we recognize we are not part of the worldly family, before the spiritist principles our loved ones refuse, we are in the position of a debtor among various creditors, with the valuable possibility of repaying our debts.

We may also describe ourselves in the situation of a student on an intensive course of individual development, with the blessed opportunity to acquire certificates of competence in various lessons.

Dangerous Points for Parents

There are difficult situations parents must be attentive.

Most of them when they:

-Disregard the importance of example in homeschooling.

-Ignore that children come to reincarnation through them without being theirs.

-Turn children into family knick-knacks, shying away from helping form their character from an early age.

-Inconsiderately help their children or overload them with obligations incompatible with their health or disposition.

-Neglect the necessary assistance under the pretext of being able to pay worthy employees, though unable to replace them in their responsibilities.

-Ignore that their children are different spirits, bearers of a moral inheritance within themselves, as happy or

unhappy remnants of previous existences.

-Wish their children to be their satellites, forgetting that they are on their path, with personal thoughts and attitudes.

-Take no interest in the studies that concern them.

-Relegate their minds to superstitions and fantasies, without giving them honest explanations about the world and life.

-Not ask them to work and cooperate as much as they can.

Spiritists, Let Us Meditate

honor its principles before cultured and attentive assemblies; however, it will not forget the fraternal, heart-to-heart understanding in which the wisest companions are willing to answer patiently the questions and calm the concerns of the less knowledgeable.

It will provide precious information to the Truth researchers in the sphere of higher knowledge it conveys; however, it will work with greater devotion on behalf of the fallen in trial and need, who knock on its door, overwhelmed with suffering.

It will pay tribute to the world science that suppresses illnesses and value the benefits of prayer and healing magnetism in aiding the sick.

It will disseminate the philosophical concept and the consoling phrase.

It will promote teaching by multiplying bread.

A Spiritist temple, reviving Christianity, is a house of human solidarity, where the steadiest brothers support the weakest and the happiest assist those who groan under misfortune.

In this sense, we can recall the appeals addressed by the Spiritual World to Spiritists through the Kardecist Codification in item 4 of chapter XX of **“The Gospel According to Spiritism”** which point us in the right course:

“Go, then, and take the divine word to the great who will despise it; to the learned who will demand proof; to the small and simple who will accept it, because especially among the martyrs of labor, in the earthly trial, you will find ardor and faith. Go! They will receive the holy consolation that you will bring them with hymns of gratitude and praise to God, and they will bow their heads, thanking for the afflictions that the Earth has brought them.”

Spiritists, let us reflect!

Let us study by feeling, understanding, building, and helping always.

Let us assist others while supporting all those who seek to help.

Jesus called together the group of apostles who provided Him with cover for His redemptive work, not to incense Himself or to lock them up in an ivory tower.

He did it to raise them to the status of faithful friends, capable of blessing, comforting, instructing and serving the people who, in all the latitudes of the Planet, constitute the loving family of His heart.

However, this does not exempt us from the worship of truth.

We look back with awe to the love that prevailed in the Christian collectivities of the Nascent Gospel.

The first followers of Jesus loved each other tenderly as true brothers; however, it was not only at the price of gentleness that they overcame sarcasm and persecution.

Their love for each other included courage, frankness, boldness, and fidelity as necessary ingredients to triumph over the time's vicissitudes as over themselves.

Let's be tolerant in constructive sense, respecting the victims of consecrated deceptions and unfortunate prejudices, giving each of them something useful that helps them to build goodness, with a view to future emancipation.

However, let's maintain a steady attitude by which we are identified as Spiritists, at the service of the renewed world, avoiding mimicry and accommodation.

Timely Assistance

Remember those who are almost mad with suffering, and work so that the Spiritist Doctrine may provide them with timely help.

To do this, let us study Allan Kardec in the light of Jesus Christ message, and, whether in example or attitude, in action or word, let us remember that Spiritism asks us for a permanent kind of charity – the charity of its dissemination.

Reflect on the importance of Spiritism in your incarnation. Let us compare it with the different circumstances in which you spend your existence.

Family – A consanguineous group to which you are forcibly linked by remnants of the past or impositions of affinity with a view to personal refinement.

Profession – A structured set of tasks that require time and effort to fulfill daily work responsibilities, involving necessary learning, whether to review past experiences or to acquire essential skills for the future.

Tests – Delayed lessons we accumulate on the way through thoughtless or conscious mistakes in past reincarnations, which we must remember and relearn.

Illnesses – Problems that we carry with us, created by vices from other times or abuses of today, that the Law imposes on us in favor of our balance.

Disappointments – Necessary cuts in our fantasies caused by our excesses, from which no one can escape.

Inhibitions – Embarrassments come from yesterday's behavior, which we must endure today in a re-educative effort.

Condition – Deserved social environment that facilitates or hinders our achievements, according to the debts and credits acquired.

It's easy to conclude that all situations of human existence are duties to which we submit ourselves under the impositions of regeneration or progress.

Nevertheless, the Spiritist Doctrine is the first sign we are entering spiritual liberation before the Universe, enabling us, through understanding justice and serving Humanity, to grow and improve ourselves towards Higher Spheres.
